A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

As I begin to write this communication to the parish, I almost don't know where to start. I did not see this coming.

On that Tuesday morning, Judie and Bev stopped at my study door to say hello. I was in the midst of a coughing spell. They both encouraged me to see a doctor. Later that same day, I stopped at the local urgent care facility to talk about my difficulty in breathing. They shared with me that I needed to drive myself to the ER as they were too busy to deal with me. Being a man, I went home. However, by 3:00 AM I was in trouble.

I then drove myself to the ER and by 2:00 PM the next day I found myself in the midst of a visit with my primary care physician. The blood test was not good. He immediately referred me to the oncologist office and from there it seemed to all go downhill. A fog seemed to enter my head. Cancer? Not me. Norma was in Ohio with my dad. I immediately called her and asked her to come home only saying that I needed her home.

At that appointment I learned that I had MDS, a very nasty kind of blood cancer. The oncologist didn't mince any words about the possible outcome, which scared me to death. A couple of days later I made another trip to the ER. This time I was diagnosed with pneumonia. Two days in the Ludington hospital and then a transfer to Grand Rapids for another 8 days. It was there that I learned that the pneumonia needed to be brought under control before any treatment for the cancer could begin. The infectious disease doctors said at least 12 weeks of treatment was needed to clear up the lungs.

Fast forward a week as we made our way back to Grand Rapids to talk with the bone marrow folks. The only way to cure the disease is with a bone marrow transplant. They are of the opinion that because of the aggressiveness of the cancer we cannot wait 12 weeks. If you are confused at this point, so are we.

Nonetheless, we will meet with the local oncologist on March 26 to learn of her opinion. My brother is packed and waiting to drive north as soon as they call so that he might be tested for a match. At this point, he is probably my best hope for the bone marrow.

So, what have I learned? Life isn't fair. Things happen that none of us can ever understand. Why me? I could ask again and again. But of this I am certain. God our Father is in the midst of this and is working to do His good will. We are not forsaken regardless of what others may think or say. I belong to Him. My plans for the future are simple. I am believing God for a full and complete recovery

I am so thankful for your love and support. Every day I receive cards reminding me of how much I am loved. Meals are being brought to our door and I am experiencing God's love in a way I never imagined. Thank You! I miss you all so much.

My prayers are extended for each of you as well, especially as we make our way through this horrible virus that is threatening our world. Please join me in prayer for the medical workers, and prayer for those who have been afflicted. God is in the midst of that "mess" as well. With God's grace, we will get through all of this.

I am not happy with the situation, but I would be really distraught if someone got sick from the virus being transmitted during our church activities. We are currently putting a service online that can be found on our website, www.gslcman.org. Just scroll down until you see a box that indicates the service (eg Service of the Word Lent 4) and click on it. At this time it is recorded weekly. The church office remains open for calls although the doors are locked. As you enter the building there are sanitary wipes and hand wash on a table just inside the door. Please avail yourselves of these measures on entering and leaving while maintaining at least the recommended 6 foot spacing between people.

During this difficult time our ability to communicate with one another is severely tested. It is difficult if not impossible to get timely information to all of you. If you wish to be notified of Good Shepherds' urgent information like weather closings send the office an email indicating that and we will add you to the list. Laurie Seidelman has started a Facebook page "Women who Pray" for inspiration and information sharing. Contact her for addition to that list.

While we are all saddened by the lack of community, the physical church goes on. Please keep in mind that we return from what we have been given and continue your tithes and offerings. These can be mailed to the church or sent via tithely.com, a link to which can be found on our website (www.gslcman.org).

Pastor Jim's Health issues continue so keep him in your thoughts and prayers as he makes decisions about his diagnosis. Pray for the doctors so that they can come up with a unified and understandable course of treatment.

Please continue your prayers for Good Shepherd, our parishioners, our government officials, the people that are sickened by this virus and Pastor Jim.
